

This September I celebrate two years of ministry at St. John's, Altamont. In the last two years I've learned that this congregation has a heart to connect and care for the community. I've also seen that the people of St. John's will support efforts to care for others from drives to gather items for a homeless shelter to supporting local families in need.

**Another anniversary is approaching**, 10 years of God's Work, Our Hands Sunday. An effort every September to have ELCA congregations work to do dome type to service for their neighbors. This September we will once again connect with our community by being a sponsor of Altamont's Fall Fest. See the Article on page 6 for more details.

We can build on our connection to the community for the benefit of anyone experiencing food insecurity in our community. At our most recent church Council meeting I proposed the idea of hosting a Little Free Pantry and inviting the community to help us steward it. There are more details about Little Free Pantries in another article in the newsletter where you can get more information about how a Little Free Pantry works. We have found a design we can build ourselves and the council will discuss where to place it on our grounds at the next council meeting.

We can do God's Work with Our Hands by telling others, handing out flyers or brochures about the little free pantry, or grabbing a few essentials to bring with you to worship that you can place in the pantry on your way into the building.

**When you come to worship, remember** that we continue to worship at 9:30am through Labor day weekend, and will return to worship at 11:00am on Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup>.

## What Is A Little Free Pantry?

Altamont has a food pantry, as does Guilderland. They are open for specific hours, on certain days to give food to clients. These are necessary and vital ministries that we currently and should continue to support. We can also add another layer to care for those experiencing food insecurity, a Little Free Pantry.

A little Free Pantry is essentially an outdoor cabinet stocked with nonperishable food items available to anyone at any time. It is an easy way for neighbors to help neighbors who need food, hygiene, or paper items.

Even though it will be housed on St. John's grounds, it will belong to everyone in the community. Everyone is invited to give what they can by placing food, hygiene, or paper items inside the mini pantry.

**Give what you would want to receive**. An easy rule of thumb: buy extra of what you buy for your household. No gift is too small. A single can of green beans can help. Items should be unexpired and in good condition.

**Take what you need**. If anyone needs an item in the Little Free Pantry they are invited to take it and know that we care about them.

Little Free Pantries work best when they are the work of an entire neighborhood, not just an effort of one congregation.
